



Restrictions Exemption Program (REP) Plan

This written plan outlines the processes and requirements of implementing the Restrictions Exemption Program (REP) at the Beaumont Curling Club.

The Beaumont Curling Club will allow the following for persons **age 12 and over to be able to enter and utilize the facility starting November 1, 2021:**

- Individuals who are **fully vaccinated** (2 doses of a 2-dose series vaccine or 1 dose of a 1-dose series vaccine).
 - Because the 2021/22 season starts November 1, 2021, all persons cannot be partially vaccinated as they must be fully vaccinated on or after October 25th.
 - NOTE: The second (2nd) dose of a 2-dose series vaccine or 1 dose of a 1-dose series vaccine must have been administered on or before Sunday October 17, 2021.
- Individuals who provide a **negative, privately paid** (cannot be from Alberta Health Services or Alberta Precision Laboratories) **Covid-19 test** that was administered within the **last 72 hours**.
- Individuals who provide a medical exemption

Personal Identification:

- All persons of the age of majority (18 and over) must provide valid personal identification along with showing proof of their vaccination status, negative Covid-19 test, or medical exemption.
 - **Valid Proof of Identification Accepted:**
 - Must include the name and date of birth of the person.
 - Examples: Birth certificate, Citizenship card, Driver's licence, Government (Alberta or other) issued identification card, including health card, Metis card, Treaty card, Inuit Status card, Passport, Permanent Resident card.

Valid Proof of Vaccination Accepted:

- A picture or paper record of a valid Alberta Health Services, MyHealth Records, pharmacy, First Nations, or physician immunization record prominently displaying the name, date of birth, type of vaccine, and date of administration.
- Canadian armed forces immunization record, displaying the name, date of birth, type of vaccine, and date of administration.
- An immunization record from another Canadian Province or Territory, displaying the name, date of birth, type of vaccine, and date of administration.
- Valid Government of Alberta Vaccination QR code.

Valid Proof of Negative Covid-19 Test Accepted:

- A written or printed copy that indicates the individual has been tested negative for Covid-19 on a Health Canada approved rapid antigen, rapid PCR, or lab based PCR test approved by Health Canada.
- It must clearly outline which laboratory completed the test if applicable, the type of test, the time of the sample collection, and a clear indication of a negative result.
- A picture of a rapid test is not sufficient and cannot be used to prove a negative result.
- The test must NOT be from an Alberta Health Services or Alberta Precision Laboratories testing system.
- The Beaumont Curling Club will NOT offer on-site rapid testing. Individuals cannot bring their own rapid tests to the Beaumont Curling Club - these are not sufficient and cannot be used to prove a negative result.

Valid Proof of Medical Exemption Accepted:

- An original signed letter from a physician or nurse practitioner that includes:
 - The individual's name matching the personal identification.
 - The physician's or nurse practitioner's information is complete by including:
 - Name, phone number, contact info, professional registration number, and signature.
 - Statement that there is a medical reason for the individual's exemption from being fully vaccinated against Covid-19.
 - The duration that the exemption is valid.
 - If any one (1) of these items is missing, the Beaumont Curling Club will NOT accept the medical exemption and therefore the person will not be permitted to enter the facility.

Vaccination Status / Negative Covid-19 Test / Medical Exemption Consent Form:

- All individuals entering the Beaumont Curling Club will need to read, agree to, and sign the “Vaccination Status / Negative Covid-19 Test / Medical Exemption Consent Form.
- This consent form does NOT require any personal health information. It is a document to show your understanding of the policies for the 2021/22 season.

Membership Cards:

- Members will be **required to stop by the office** privately and **show a designated Beaumont Reps their proof of vaccination or medical exemption**. Once their proof has been seen - along with personal identification (for persons of age of majority) - the member will **sign the consent form** and then be **issued a Membership Card**.
- This Membership Card will have the member’s name and signature, the date, and the initials of the Beaumont Representative. **For the remainder of the season, the member will only need to show their Membership Card to be eligible for entry, random checks, or auditing.**
- Regular guests, spectators, spares, and others may be eligible for a Membership Card in an effort to fast track the daily curler check ins.
- Members who show a negative Covid-19 test will **NOT** be issued a card, as they will be required to show proof of a negative test every 72 hours.

Staff Training:

- The General Manager and Assistant Manager will be made fully aware of the REP Plan. They will be the Beaumont Reps who can issue a Membership Card. Only the General Manager and Assistant Manager have access to the records of who has a Membership Card.
- Any staff member may check for proof of a Membership Card.

Protecting Personal Information:

- The Beaumont Curling Club will not collect any personal health information of vaccination status, negative Covid-19 tests, or medical exemptions.
- The “Vaccination Status / Medical Exemption Consent Form” will be stored in a locked filing cabinet for the duration of the 2021/22 season. These forms will be shredded by September 15, 2022.
 - NOTE: This consent form does NOT require any personal health information. It is a document to show your understanding of the policies for the 2021/22 season.
- All persons who enter the building and are issued a Membership Card will have a checkbox next to their name indicating that they have been issued a Membership Card.

Autiding:

- Officials from Alberta Health Services, the Alberta Gaming, Liquor, Cannabis, and police units may arrive at the Beaumont Curling Club, requesting patrons to show their proof of vaccination, negative Covid-19 test, or medical exemption.
- The Beaumont Curling Club will work in full compliance with these officials.

Non-Compliant Policies:

- All individuals wanting to enter the building will be asked to show their Membership Card (if issued one), otherwise proof of vaccination, negative Covid-19 test, or medical exemption.
- Those who do not provide the requested information will NOT be allowed entry into the building and will be asked to leave.
- Those who do not leave after being told to will be considered trespassing and if needed, the Beaumont RCMP non-emergency line will be called at **780-929-7410**. If aggressive behaviour is shown by the individual and a person's life is threatened in any way, **911** will be dialed.
