



RAFFLE RULES

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

For participants in the 2021/22 Raffle including, but not limited to the members, guests, staff, and executives of the Beaumont Curling Club.

A. LEGISLATION AND BOARD POLICIES

1. The licensed charity will operate the raffle according to the Criminal Code of Canada, the Alberta Gaming Liquor and Cannabis Act, the Alberta Gaming Liquor and Cannabis Regulation, and the Board policies established under the legislation, including these terms and conditions.
2. The licensed charity will adhere to all federal, provincial and municipal laws.
3. Non-compliance with federal, provincial, or municipal laws or Board policies may result in disciplinary action, up to and including suspension or cancellation of license.
4. Licensed charities will ensure their raffle event is conducted and managed completely within the province of Alberta.
5. Changes to a license may only be made through a license amendment issued by the AGLC. Requests for approval to amend a license will be made in writing to the AGLC by two executive officers of the licensed charity. If the approved amendments affect the awarding of prizes, the Raffle Committee will discuss further action.

B. RAFFLE RULES

1. Raffle rules will include the following:
 - a. Raffle tickets will not be sold to a person under 18 years of age;
 - b. There are no restrictions on the licensed charity's members, or their families, buying tickets;
 - c. A minimum of 1500 tickets must be sold before requesting a draw date extension or cancelling the raffle.
 - d. The Raffle Draw will be on June 25, 2022 at the Beaumont Curling Club, located at 5303 50 Street Beaumont Alberta, T4X 1J8.
 - e. 6000 tickets in booklets of 10 each will be available for sale at a purchase price of \$10 per each individual ticket.
 - f. The draw will take place with The Grand Prize (a) drawn first, followed by prizes b,c,d,e,f, in that order.
 - a) The Grand Prize (\$6500 cash)
 - b) The Second prize (\$2500 cash)
 - c) The Third Prize (\$1000 cash)
 - d) The Fourth Prize (\$1000 cash)
 - e) The Fifth Prize (\$500 cash)
 - f) The Sixth Prize (\$500 cash)
 - g. After each ticket is drawn, and the information properly recorded, it will be put back into the draw container before the next prize draw is made.
 - h. Prizes will be available to be picked up at the Beaumont Curling Club.
 - i. Winners have one year from date of draw to claim their prize. The Beaumont Curling Club will store, in a secure area, any/all unclaimed prizes. If after one year, the prizes go unclaimed, the Beaumont Curling Club, with approval from AGLC, will donate the prize or equivalent cash value to an approved Charity.



- j. If a winning ticket has more than one name on it, the prize will be awarded to the first name that is printed on the ticket. Neither the Beaumont Curling Club nor AGLC is responsible for any disputes among the individuals whose names are written on the ticket.
2. A copy of each ticket type printed will be sent to the AGLC, if requested.
3. The Beaumont Curling Club will print only the number of tickets indicated and approved in the application for license.
4. The Beaumont Curling Club will sell tickets only at the price or prices indicated and approved in the application for license.
5. Raffle tickets may be sold in person, over the phone or by email with a picture of the ticket and stub sent via email for cash, cheque, e-transfer, or credit card (Mastercard or Visa only) made payable to the licensed group.
6. Raffle tickets will not be sold on any online platforms.
7. Tickets will be in two parts, as follows:
 - a. One stub, to be kept by the Beaumont Curling Club. The stub will include the following information:
 - i. The buyer's name, address and telephone number;
 - ii. The ticket number; and
 - iii. The license number.
 - b. One part, to be given to the buyer. This part of the ticket will include the following information:
 - i. The licensed charity's name and address;
 - ii. The license number;
 - iii. The ticket number;
 - iv. The ticket price;
 - v. The total number of tickets printed;
 - vi. The exact location(s) and date(s) of draw(s);
 - vii. A description and value of prize(s);
 - viii. The notice: "Restrictions apply to prizes" (if applicable);
 - ix. The notice of cash alternatives (if applicable); and
 - x. The notice: "Must be at least 18 years of age to purchase."
8. Ticket sales must take place within Alberta. Persons visiting from out of province may purchase a ticket if the entire transaction of payment and receipt of ticket occurs while the person is in Alberta.
9. All lost and stolen tickets will be reported to the AGLC immediately. A Discrepancy Report will be submitted to the AGLC within 3 days of discovering the lost or stolen tickets. The Discrepancy Report will specify the total number and serial numbers of the lost or stolen tickets and an explanation for how the tickets were lost or stolen.
10. If the tickets were lost or stolen before they were sold, the licensed group will advertise in the market area where the tickets were lost or stolen that these tickets will not form part of the draw and will not be eligible for prizes. In addition, at location of draw(s) prior to the draw, the licensed charity will announce the lost or stolen tickets will not form part of the draw.



11. The licensed charity must be able to account for all tickets. Prior to the draw, the licensed charity will reconcile the number of sold tickets and unsold tickets, as indicated in the raffle ticket sales record, with the number of ticket stubs in the draw container, to ensure that all eligible tickets form part of the draw.
12. All draws must be open to the public. At least one executive member of the licensed group and one member of the public who is not a member of the licensed group will be present to witness each draw.
13. Tickets must be drawn from a container that is transparent or constructed with mesh so that tickets can be seen from the outside.
14. Tickets must be manually drawn from the container in a random manner. Winning tickets cannot be randomly drawn by a computer or other random number-generating device.
15. A ticket stub containing the ticket number of each sold ticket must be placed in the draw container prior to the prize draws.
16. A record of each ticket drawn will be made indicating the ticket number, the name, address, phone number of the prize-winner, and the time and date the ticket was drawn.
17. Once drawn, winning tickets will be immediately exhibited to witnesses and held open for inspection until the end of the draw or until returned to the draw container to be eligible for additional prizes.

Purchase Procedure:

1. Raffle tickets may be sold in person, over the phone, or by email. If sold by phone or email, the stub that the buyer receives will be mailed to the address provided for the ticket.
2. Purchases can be made using the following forms of payment: cash, cheque, e-transfer, or credit card (Mastercard or Visa only) made payable to the licensed group.
3. Raffle tickets will not be sold on any online platforms.

Refund Policy:

1. If a draw date is amended and a ticket buyer requests a ticket price refund, the licensed charity will issue a full refund to the ticket buyer.
2. If the tickets were lost or stolen after they were sold, the licensed group will advertise in the market area that tickets with the affected serial numbers were lost or stolen and will not form part of the draw, and anyone holding such a ticket should contact the licensed charity so that either another ticket can be issued or a refund provided.
3. Refunds will not be issued for any reason other than the two indicated above (draw date amended or lost/stolen sold tickets).
